### **As it pertains to Grades and Promotion to the next grade level:**

Each traditional year-long course will utilize grades from quarters 1-3 to determine the final grade for the course, which ended on March 13, 2020. The final grade for the course and related credit will be awarded to students who achieved the requisite proficiency through the 3rd quarter.

### *Credits needed for promotion to:*

- 10th Grade – 5 credits
- 11th Grade – 11 credits
- 12th Grade – 17 credits

### **For those students who were not proficient at the end of the 3rd Quarter:**

Hālau Kū Māna will provide multiple opportunities to demonstrate proficiency until the last day for students, which is *May 21st, 2020*. We will provide remediation and intervention at the earliest date or means possible and will work with teachers and counselors to find a solution for students who need credit recovery support.

  - One-to-one online options
  - Credit recovery programming
  - Printed materials and instructional packets with teacher check-ins (correspondence courses)
  - Project-based learning (Performance-based assessments)
  - Portfolios

**Grade Point Average and Transcripts**

Hālau Kū Māna will use Q1-3 grades to determine final grades; we will then utilize these final grades under the current policies for calculation of yearly and cumulative GPAs. Final grades will then be posted to student transcripts.
